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Sustainability Appraisal (incorporating SEA) Assessment of the Matters Arising Changes

Pembrokeshire County Council has prepared Matters Arising Changes to the Deposit LDP. These changes have been reviewed as part of the Sustainability Appraisal process (incorporating Strategic Environmental Assessment). This is to determine whether there are likely to be any significant sustainability effects arising from the changes to the plan. Each of the proposed changes has been screened to determine whether the change is significant and also whether the change would result in significant sustainability effects.

It was noted that most of the changes were minor in nature, for example relating to matters of clarification, text corrections, or addition of detail to the text of the plan policy or supporting justification text. It was, therefore, considered that the majority of the Matters Arising Changes were unlikely to have a significant effect beyond those already identified and assessed and that no further SA/SEA work would be required.

However, 10 changes were considered to be sufficiently different that they should be re-considered against the SA Objectives to determine the potential for significant effects. These are assessed below. •

- Paragraph 5.2 Change of housing delivery to 60% urban and 40% rural (MAC 9).
- SP 5 Change to Strategic Visitor Economy policy wording from requiring proposals to enhance the environment to requiring them to respect and protect (MAC 15).
- SP 8 Change of Affordable Housing target from 1,450 to 980 affordable housing dwellings (MAC 22).
- GN.4 Revisions to policy text no longer requiring additional criteria for major developments (MAC 44).
- Narberth Employment Site at Redstone Road (SA supplied by applicant at Alternative Sites stage reproduced here for information) (MAC 48).
- GN.29 Local Needs Affordable Housing new policy introducing additional flexibility to respond to viability issues (MAC 92).
- GN.35A New policy on Green Wedges (MAC 101).
- SP 2 Map boundary changes (MAC 120)
- PM 31 Blackbridge alteration to Transport Route (MAC 124).

"The strategy focuses on enabling development in accordance with the objectives and subobjectives established in Figure 2 Chapter 4: It includes a settlement strategy that aims to achieve a balanced distribution of new development between urban and rural Pembrokeshire. Within the rural area, growth is focused on those settlements with a good level of service provision. It is anticipated that 60% of housing will be built in the urban areas and 40% in the rural areas⁴² "

The strategy is consistent with all of the SA objectives and will contribute to delivering many of them. The likely development of less affordable housing in rural areas than originally anticipated may result in less cohesive communities in some locations but may also mean less travel from unsustainable locations. Should there be an identified need for additional affordable housing in rural areas, the policy framework can support additional delivery. The overall strategy is likely to deliver benefits in terms of supporting communities and the economy across the Plan area. Other general policies including the use of settlement boundaries will provide protection to the landscape and ensure that biodiversity is protected.

Tourism in Pembrokeshire is a major generator for the local economy and provides employment opportunities within the County. The nature of tourism is diverse, different but interdependent activities and operations overlap with other leisure and recreation provisions, it therefore may be difficult to determine direct effects which have resulting from the policy and/or details of the policy. Due to the seasonality of the industry it is difficult to accurately identify effects which may influence the relationship between the policy and SA Objectives. The policy does require all developments to be located sustainably and to respect and protect the environment and benefit local communities, it could therefore be concluded that the policy is sufficient to ensure social and environmental impacts will not be negative. The absence of detail within the policy makes it difficult to accurately assess the impact visitor economy may have. Greater detail provided in the general policies which establish what sustainably located means.

Pembrokeshire's aging population has been identified as a trend which needs to be limited and where possible reversed. The provision of affordable housing as part of major housing developments and through land allocations should significantly contribute towards a balanced population and promote vibrant and cohesive communities through mixed tenure developments. The same impacts in terms of biodiversity, landscape and resource use apply to affordable housing developments as they would to non affordable housing developments, where potential impacts are considered likely this policy in combination with other detailed policies will be used to mitigate for protect where appropriate. There is currently a backlog of affordable housing need in Pembrokeshire, it is envisaged the amount of affordable housing developed under this policy will contribute to meeting the backlog, this may in the long term lead to improved health and well being. The Matters Arising Change reduces the target figure for affordable housing which may result in a less balanced population than the original target figure, this however reflects the number of units that it is considered can be reasonably delivered by the Plan in the current economic circumstances.

GN.4 Resource Efficiency and Renewable and Low-carbon Energy Proposals

Amend policy to read:

"Development proposals should seek to minimise resource demand, improve resource efficiency and utilise seek power generated from renewable resources, where appropriate.

They will be expected to be well designed in terms of energy use. ^{79 80}

For all major developments:

- 1. Developers must show that they have addressed sustainable resource issues, by reference to accredited assessment schemes, and in the case of commercial developments must undertake an energy use assessment and consider the feasibility of incorporating Combined Heat and Power (CHP) schemes:
- 2. Energy efficient measures must be incorporated to provide a proportion of their energy requirements from on-site renewable power generation, in line with UK commitments; and
- 3. Proposals will be required to demonstrate the effective re-use of waste heat and power through co-location with energy users and / or carbon capture where feasible.

Developments which enable the supply of renewable energy through environmentally acceptable solutions will be supported."

This policy impacts on a range of the SA Objectives. From a social perspective, human health and well being may benefit as a result of a cleaner environment and improved air quality. The policy directly influences the resource efficiency of housing development. The economy should benefit from a diversification in employment roles and an increase in opportunities which will help support a sustainable a local economy. The environment will benefit from this policy in the long term by reducing the impact on resources and indirectly by reducing greenhouse gas emissions due to the use of renewable resources. This will reduce the impact and contribution to climate change and promote sustainable development. The Matters Arising Change proposed removes the requirement for major developments to provide a proportion of their energy requirements from on site renewable generation or to demonstrate effective re-use of waste heat and power, however the wording of the remaining policy in requiring development proposals to minimise resource demand and improve resource efficiency as well as seeking power generated from renewable resources where appropriate retains will require a developer to assess such options on all developments.

GN.29 Local Needs Affordable Housing

Amend policy and text to read:

GN.29 Local Needs Affordable Housing Provision

Local needs affordable housing will be a requirement:

- 1. at a rate of 25% in Towns, Service Centres and Service Villages;
- 2. at a rate of 50% in Large Local Villages; and
- 3. for all new dwellings in Small Local Villages.

6.116 The need for affordable housing is acute in Pembrokeshire, with the Local Housing Market Assessment indicating it is the least affordable county in Wales and a survey by Halifax Estate Agents suggesting an average income to house price ratio of 7.4:1 in 2008. This is further supported by evidence from housing waiting list data and Community Council surveys. The Welsh Government has made the delivery of affordable housing a priority for the planning system, and a community's need for affordable housing is a material planning consideration.

6.117 The expected percentage of affordable homes on each qualifying site is derived from extensive and comprehensive testing of housing viability, undertaken in 2010. The viability tests, conducted using the 3 Dragons Development Appraisal Toolkit, have regard to unique site characteristics and allow for changes to the state of the economy and the economics of development. Where on site provision is impractical, for small scale developments (less than 5 in a Town, Service Centre or Service Village, less than 2 in a Large Local Village) or for developments where otherwise the percentage would be reduced by 'rounding down' the Council will seek a commuted sum contribution to support off site affordable housing provision. Where a developer can demonstrate that the expected percentage is not deliverable, they may negotiate with the LPA to ensure delivery of a reasonable number of affordable homes, which contributes to meeting the need for affordable homes in Pembrokeshire. In local villages the objective of residential development is to meet the need for more affordable homes in rural areas and therefore concerns over the viability of development do not justify any relaxation of the policy.

6.118 The Authority will not accept piecemeal development of large sites, whether allocated or otherwise, as a means of avoiding the requirement for affordable housing. It is anticipated that approximately 1450 new affordable homes will be provided over the Plan period.

6.119 The affordable housing provided under this policy must be available in perpetuity for local people in need of affordable housing within the community and permission will be subject to conditions or a planning obligation to ensure that this will be the case. Definitions of "local" and "in need" can be found in the Affordable Housing SPG. Evidence of need for affordable housing will be determined using the Common Housing Register and Community Council surveys. Further information on the form of affordable housing (either affordable rented or low cost home ownership) and mechanisms linked to delivery are also provided in

the SPG on Affordable Housing.

"GN.29 Local Needs Affordable Housing

Local needs affordable housing will be sought on all housing developments. Indicative targets for provision on allocated sites are set out in Policy GN.28, and on unallocated sites the provision shall be as follows:

- 1 In Towns, Service Centres and Service Villages 10% of dwellings proposed will be affordable.
- 2 In Large Local Villages 50% of the dwellings proposed will be affordable.
- 3 In Small Local Villages all new dwellings must be affordable.

Where it is demonstrated that the provision of an affordable dwelling on site is not possible¹¹¹ a commuted sum contribution for affordable housing will be sought. The commuted sum shall be related to the contribution rates set out above and charged on the basis of floorspace (per sq. metre).

The authority may seek a higher percentage contribution on any site where local circumstances and/or recent developments in the area suggest it would be financially viable. Where a sustained positive change in the financial viability of development can be demonstrated through monitoring¹¹² the local authority will seek a higher percentage contribution towards affordable housing. In Towns, Services Centres and Service Villages a provision of affordable housing below the target figure may be appropriate where this is supported by economic viability evidence.

6.116 The need for affordable housing is acute in Pembrokeshire, evidenced by housing waiting list data, Local Housing Market Assessments and Community Council surveys. The Welsh Government has made the delivery of affordable housing a priority for the planning system¹¹³, and a community's need for affordable housing is a material planning consideration. It is anticipated that at least 980 new affordable homes will be provided over the Plan period.

6.117 The authority will seek a material or financial contribution to affordable housing from all new open market housing developments in order to maximise the delivery of affordable housing in an effort to meet the existing and newly-arising need. Where the site is large enough the developer will be expected to provide affordable housing on-site, in accordance with percentage targets stated in GN.28 (for housing allocations) or GN.29 (for windfall sites). These targets are derived from housing viability tests and form an indicative target. The viability tests, conducted using the 3 Dragons Development Appraisal Toolkit, have regard to unique site characteristics and allow for changes to the state of the economy and the economics of

development. Where a developer can demonstrate that the expected percentage is not deliverable, they may negotiate with the LPA to ensure delivery of a reasonable number of affordable homes, which contribute to meeting the need for affordable homes in Pembrokeshire. In Local Villages the objective of residential development is to meet the need for more affordable homes in rural areas and therefore concerns over the viability of development do not justify any relaxation of the policy.

6.118 If on site provision is impractical, for example on small scale developments or where through 'rounding' a large site is left with a fraction of an affordable dwelling to provide, the Council will seek a commuted sum contribution to support off site affordable housing provision.

6.119 All affordable housing must be available in perpetuity for people in need of affordable housing and any planning permission will be subject to conditions or a planning obligation to ensure that this will be the case. The Authority will not accept piecemeal development of large sites, whether allocated or otherwise, as a means of avoiding the requirement for affordable housing. Affordable Housing SPG contains important details of tenure and type of affordable housing sought by the authority. It also establishes how the contribution percentage rate may be adjusted and how a commuted sum will be applied."

- Fishguard / Goodwick
- Fishguard / Lower Town
- Tenby / Penally

These areas have particular importance in maintaining the distinct identities of separate communities. Within the Green Wedges there will be a general presumption against inappropriate development.

6.47a Green Wedges play an important role in maintaining Pembrokeshire's landscape setting and preserving openness. Land on the edge of the Hub Towns and tourism centres is vulnerable to the pressure of development, this in turn can result in the urbanisation of rural areas, coalescence of settlements and loss of important green space. This policy aims to identify and protect such vulnerable areas from inappropriate development, as defined in national policy119, with development proposals determined in accordance with PPW paragraphs 4.7.14-4.7.18.



This policy presents various opportunities to help achieve some of the SA Objectives but it will depend on what development is decided upon and permitted within the spatial areas defined on the maps in the ports of Milford Haven and Fishguard. Development could contribute towards building new cohesive communities, support a diversification in the economy and improve human health and well being by improving the environment. New developments could follow sustainable principles and include renewable technologies to ensure good design. Port developments could help to reduce the impacts of climate change by being resource efficient and supporting energy conservation and renewable energy. Any new developments will also help support the local economy by providing job opportunities and potentially diversifying the economy. A potential negative impact of port development is the potential impact on water quality and the marine environment. During construction there could be disruption to marine habitats and an increase in marine activities and traffic could reduce water quality and increase pollution. Policies in the LDP will ensure any negative impacts are mitigated and minimised. Developments will require HRA at a project level.

Local road improvement scheme – Blackbridge Access Improvement and Waterston bypass

The original allocation was assessed under the Regional Transport Plan SEA (see SA Report Post Deposit Changes Appendices). The route has been revised using the Welsh Transport Planning and Appraisal Guidance (WELTAG) which incorporates SA/SEA. A revised summary SA has been produced below, which summarises the information from the two documents.
