

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV system installed at premises.

The system must incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard drive to a format that can be played back on any Windows compatible computer.

The system must be capable of recording and retaining thirty one days of images before over-recording.

Recording equipment must record date and time information as part of the image file, and the date/time must be accurate.

All users must be fully trained in the operation of the system and be made aware of their general legal responsibilities.

There must be a competent person present on the premises, capable of replay and export of recordings quickly onto a removable storage medium always when the premises are open to the public and produce a copy to the police or a responsible authority.

The system must be registered with the Information Commissioner.

c) Public safety

Telephone on premises for use in an emergency.

A list of all persons authorised to sell alcohol will be kept.

All glasses and bottles will be removed from the public area as soon as they are finished with or empty.

All exits and the external area will be well lit.

An incident register will be maintained, which will record a true record of any incident including time and date, and details of the incident. The entry will be signed and dated by the person making the entry.

The premises will be kept clean and tidy, and enough suitable receptacles with properly fitted covers will be provided for the purpose of receiving refuge from the premises.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Notices shall be displayed at all exits doors requesting patrons to leave the premises and the area quietly and to respect the needs of residents. Alcohol will only be consumed on the premises ancillary to a table meal.
All off sales of alcohol will be in sealed containers.
No customers carrying any form of alcoholic drinks, whether open or sealed will be admitted to the premises.

e) The protection of children from harm

If any person attempting to purchase is suspected to be under 18 years of age identification will be sought in the form of a driving licence or passport and if neither document is produced no sale will be made.

Any person consuming alcohol on premises and is believed to be under 18 years of age will be asked to produce a document bearing his/her name, photograph, date of birth and holographic mark or ultraviolet feature. If that document is not produced the alcohol will be confiscated except when alcohol is consumed with a table meal in accordance with legislation.

When alcohol is delivered with take away food it will be handed over to a person over eighteen years of age, and if age is in doubt identification will be sought in the form of a driving licence or passport. If neither document is produced no delivery of the alcohol will be made.

A register will be kept of all refused sales of alcohol at the premises or when the delivery of alcohol is refused.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of

consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.

- 3. In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:
 - Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
