All staff will receive training in relation to the above legislation, and a record will be kept of that training.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV system installed covering all entrances to the premises and the external area.
The system must incorporate a means of transferring images from the hard drive to a format that can be played back on any Windows compatible computer.
The system must be capable of recording and retaining 31 days of images before over-recording.
Recording equipment must record date and time information as part of the image file, and the date/time must be accurate.
All users must be fully trained in the operation of the system and be made aware of their general legal responsibilities.
There must be a competent person present on the premises, capable of replay and export of recordings quickly onto a removable storage medium always when the premises are open to the public and produce a copy to the police or a responsible authority as defined by the Licensing Act 2003.
The system must be registered with the Information Commissioner.
No person will be allowed entry to the premises if they appear to be under the influence of drink or drugs.

c) Public safety

First aid box on premises.
Notices will be displayed on both floors identifying the location of the first aid box.
Telephone on premises for use in an emergency.
A list of all persons authorised to sell alcohol will be kept.
Doctors will be present before and during boxing or wrestling events.
The boxing or wrestling ring will be erected by a competent person and inspected by a competent authority.
Material used to form the skirt around the ring must be fire retardant.
Public seating must be a minimum of 2.5 metres away from the boxing or wrestling ring.
Occupancy figures agreed by the fire authority must be complied with in the licensed areas on both floors and must be displayed on notices.
Registered doorpersons will be provided on the ground floor if following a risk assessment, they are considered necessary, and when needed there will be a minimum of two doorpersons for the first hundred persons and an additional one for an additional hundred persons or part of a hundred.
A doorpersons register will be maintained.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Notices shall be displayed at all exits doors requesting patrons to leave the premises and the area quietly and to respect the needs of residents.
All off sales will be in sealed containers.
Premises double glazed.
Entry to the ground floor halls will only be gained via an internal hallway.
Entry to the first floor will only be gained via doorway on the ground floor from Lewis Street, and then via a lift or staircase.
Any sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises will be in sealed containers only.
No alcohol will be allowed to be brought on to the premises.

e) The protection of children from harm

If any person attempting to purchase is suspected to be under 18 years of age identification will be sought in the form of a driving licence or passport and if neither document is produced no sale will be made.
Any person consuming alcohol on premises and is believed to be under 18 years of age will be asked to produce a document bearing his/her name, photograph, date of birth and holographic mark or ultraviolet feature. If that document is not produced the alcohol will be confiscated.
A register of all refused sales will be kept.
Consumption of alcohol will be in accordance with legislation.
A notice will be displayed at each point of sale stating, 'It is an offence for a person under eighteen years of age to attempt to purchase alcohol'.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.
3. In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:
 - Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:

- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
 - Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
