NB: The Authority will seek to prioritise spending affordable housing commuted sums in the communities in which they are generated. In order to do this, the Authority will spend any contributions from commuted sums on Affordable Housing Schemes within the Town or Community council and adjoining Community Council areas within it was generated within 3 years. If, following 3 years, no suitable scheme has been commenced and the sum has not been spent, the Authority will then allocated spending the contribution on any Affordable Housing scheme across the whole of Pembrokeshire (including the National Park) for a further 2 years.
