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What is Foundation Phase Nursery (FPN)?

The Foundation Phase Nursery provides the start of the Foundation Phase curriculum (FPN) in Wales. All children in Wales are entitled to a free, part-time Foundation Phase Nursery place in an approved early years setting from the term following their third birthday and prior to gaining full time entry into school.

Pembrokeshire County Council agrees to provide the funding received from Welsh Government to offer all eligible children a minimum of 10 hours funded part-time education in an approved setting during the school term. Parents can choose to take up the child's entitlement either in a **maintained** or a **non-maintained setting**.

A maintained setting – a nursery class in a school offering 10 hours or more a week of funded Foundation Phase Nursery (FPN).

OR

A non-maintained setting – which could be a private day nursery, a playgroup or a Cylch Meithrin that has approved status offering **10 hours a week** of funded Foundation Phase Nursery (FPN) over a minimum of 3 days.

All non-maintained approved settings who receive the funding:

- Are registered with the local education authority to deliver the part time Foundation Phase Nursery
- Are Inspected by CIW and ESTYN on a regular basis
- Supported by a qualified teacher on a regular basis
- Have appropriately trained staff
- Deliver Foundation Phase Curriculum (statutory curriculum for all three to seven year olds in Wales)



What will my child gain from attending Foundation Phase Nursery in a non-maintained setting?

Although it is not statutory for your child to attend Foundation Phase Nursery prior to gaining full time place in school, this is a very important phase in your child's life as it lays the building blocks for their future learning and is part of the current and future curriculum. Foundation Phase Nursery (also referred to as FPN) is a general term used to describe the time your child spends in the Foundation Phase during the ages of three and four.



How do I apply for Foundation Phase Nursery in a non-maintained setting?

You will need to talk to the childcare provider (non-maintained setting) that you are currently using (or intend to use) for your child's funded Foundation Phase Nursery.

The childcare provider will check when your child will become eligible. If your child is eligible, you will be asked to complete an on-line parent application:

How does it work?

1. Contact your chosen Foundation Phase Nursery setting and have your child's place agreed

Whilst applicants will be signing a disclaimer to confirm that they meet the criteria for eligibility, it is expected that each application is also supported by documentary evidence of the child's date of birth (either a birth certificate/passport/medical health records) and proof of a Pembrokeshire address.









3. Once you have submitted your application, you will receive an email confirming that your application has been received.



4. It can take up to 14 working days for your application to be processed. Once your application has been processed, you will receive another email approving/declining your application.



5. If your application has been approved, an email will be sent to your chosen non-maintained setting with confirmation of a funded place.

Funding will then be released directly to your chosen setting once the application has been approved.

When can my child access Foundation Phase Nursery (FPN)?
